How you can help at home.



Reading

This half term we will continue to send home an additional library book with your child's reading book. The reading books will continue to contain a range of phase 3 words as well as the high frequency words that we learn in sign and shine. In class we will also be reading a second book that will not go home. This book will contain sounds from their current phonics group to allow them to practice sounding words out.



Writing

We will continue to teach Letters and Sounds Phonics this half term. It would greatly help your child if they regularly have a go at writing at home. Children are more likely to want and enjoy writing if done in short, sharp bursts. For example, write down the ingredients as you make a cake or write labels or signs as you build a den together.



Numeracy

This half term we will be continuing to work on adding and taking away. At this age we do this in very practical ways for example adding two groups of objects by counting them all. It would help your child to practice this as much as possible at home by doing things such as counting the total of red and blue toy cars they have. We are also looking at the names and values of coins. It would help your child to understand the value of coins by being giving opportunities to use them in real life situations e.g. buying 5 penny sweets with a 5p coin.

Half Termly Overview of Work



<u>Handa's Surprise</u> - Our focus story in literacy will be Handa's Surprise. We will be exploring the story answering 'who', 'what' and 'where' questions and comparing it to other stories we have read. We will learn to retell the story using story maps and role-play.

<u>Inventing Stories</u> - As we have explored each story this school year we have asked ourselves the same questions, who is in the story? Where is the story? And what happens? We will now begin inventing our own stories, initially through drama and lead it onto writing. We will create a story patter together as a class and then experiment with changing the characters.



Numeracy - This term we will be:

- In practical activities beginning to use the language of adding and subtracting
- Using objects to add and subtract single digit number, counting on or back to find the answer.
- Beginning to solve mathematical based problems, including doubling, halving and sharing.
- Using everyday language to talk about money, comparing quantities and solving problems

Science

This half term we are learning about 'Being Healthy'. In this topic we will be learning about the importance for good health through physical exercise, a healthy diet and talk about ways to keep healthy. We will go to the supermarket and buy a range of healthy foods and we will try a new fruit each day at snack time. We will make fruit smoothies learning about the importance of washing hands and using knives safely.



This half term we will continue Letters and Sounds phonics Phase 2 and 3.

Phase 1- This will include tuning into sounds in the environment as well as in words.

<u>Phase 2</u>- Children will continue to progress through the phase 2 sounds S,A,T,P,I,N,M,D,G,O,C,K,CK,E,U,R,B,F,H,L and will begin to put these sounds together to read and write simple words.

<u>Phase 3</u> - Children will continue to learn about di-graphs (sounds with two letters) and put these in words for reading and writing. The sounds covered in this phase are

J,V,W,X,Y,Z,ZZ,QU,CH,SH,TH,NG,AI,EE,IGH,OA,OO,AR,OR,UR,OW,OI,EAR,AIR,URE,ER.

This half term the topic is 'Faith'.

Computing - Reception will be continuing to practice logging onto and off the computers. They will also start to use the tools in 2Paint with more purpose.



PE - Reception will be doing 'Games' this half term.



Homework

We will send home a reading book every day to be read for 5 minutes every night.

Key words have been sent home in children's book bags- these are words that cannot be sounded out and therefore need to be learnt from memory.
