Numeracy: Practise your times tables at home, this is a really great skill to help with lots of different numeracy tasks.

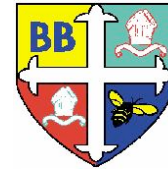

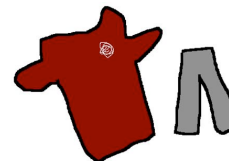

Half Termly Overview of Work



Literacy: This half term we will be looking at non-fiction texts and creating our own non-fiction text on our topic, Kenya. We will be looking at the features, such as sections and sub-headings. We will create text maps to help us identify organisational features.



Numeracy: We will continue to work multiplication, applying this to division and problem solving. We will be investigating different weights and measures, including length, weight and capacity.
