

How you can help at home.



Reading

- Reading at home with your child a minimum of 4 times a week will enable your child to make the maximum progress in reading. This does not have to be a class-reading book. If you require any further reading books for you child please don't hesitate to speak to the class teacher. This is especially important at this time of assessment.



Writing

- Encourage your child to practice their writing at home such as writing a recount of an exciting day out or a set of instructions. Check for capital letters, full stops and ask them if they can read it back to check it makes sense.
- Practice spellings using spelling frame for weekly spelling test.
- Key word practice.



Numeracy

- Telling the time would be a fantastic advantage to the children.
- Learning 2,10, 5 times tables.

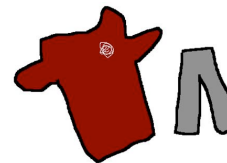
