

How You can Help at home.



Reading

This year, we expect children to be reading at least 5 times a week. This can be either school reading books or any other reading material. Please read with your child and make a record of this in their homework diaries. Children may also receive homework relating to their school book once a week.



Writing

Your child will be expected to write in neat cursive writing at all times. As well as taking part in handwriting lessons at school, we expect children to practice whilst at home.



Numeracy

In year 5 children are expected to know all of their times tables. If your child struggles with multiplication then we ask that they practice at home frequently



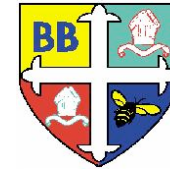

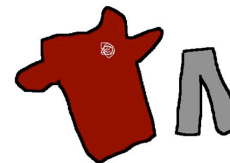

Half Termly Overview of Work



Literacy

In literacy this half term we will be looking at persuasive writing and choral and performance poetry.



Numeracy

In numeracy this half term we will be starting by looking at angles, place value, gathering and representing data and written methods for calculations. Children will also be given mental maths questions twice a week to improve their mental strategies.

Science

This half term we are studying Space and the Solar System. Lessons will consist of both practical experiments, research and written work.



Topic

We will be learning about prehistoric civilisations and the differences between then and now and answer questions such as; what did the average caveman eat? What did they do for fun? And where did they live?
