This Month's Bible Story

### Ethos Activity To Do At Home



Each month we will highlight one of the activities that Ethos children published in one of the 3 books they wrote.

#### <u>Doodle Prayers</u>

You will need - Sheet of plain paper, selection of felt tip pens and pencils. This activity makes Activity drawing and doodling a prayer space. As you add marks, names, flowers, hearts and other shapes, ask God to be part of your prayer time. If you would like to pray for someone in particular, write their name and doodle around it while you offer your prayer to God. We found doodling is a way to become still on the inside and prepare for a time of prayer, talking and listening to God. We found doodling helped us to sit with God. We found that with the movement of our hands and focusing on prayer by drawing, we were less distracted by other things.
